

## Photoshop Shortcuts the Cool-Kids Know

To create easy flashcards, fold sheet in half on the dotted line and glue or tape in place. After folding, cut along solid lines.

Note: all shortcuts are the same on PC and Mac...

For a PC, just use the "Ctrl" key in lieu of the Mac "Command" key, and the "Alt" key in lieu of the "Option" key

<b>Undo previous step</b>	Command z
<b>Show / Hide tools</b>	Tab
<b>Show / hide other stuff (such as selections/rulers/etc)</b>	Command h
<b>Open General Preferences</b>	Command k
<b>Open Color Settings Preferences</b>	Shift Command k
<b>Full Screen Mode</b>	f
<b>Ways to zoom  (a partial list)</b>	Command + / -  Option scroll mouse  Command spacebar/click
<b>Top left / bottom right of image (if zoomed in)</b>	Home key / end key
<b>Show/hide rulers</b>	Command r

<b>Marquee</b>  <b>Constrain marquee to 1:1 ratio</b>  <b>Make the starting point the center of the marquee</b>	<b>m</b>  Shift (when in marquee tool)  Option (in marquee tool)
<b>Lasso</b>	<b>l</b>
<b>Crop</b>	<b>c</b>
<b>Spot Healing/patch</b>	<b>j</b>
<b>Paintbrush/Pencil</b>	<b>b</b>
<b>Rubber Stamp</b>	<b>s</b>
<b>Eraser</b>	<b>e</b>
<b>Hand</b>	<b>spacebar</b>
<b>Eyedropper/Color Sampler/Measure</b>	<b>i</b>
<b>Default Colors</b>	<b>d</b>
<b>Switch Colors</b>	<b>x</b>
<b>Move Tool</b>	<b>Command</b>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Type Tool</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">t</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Switch between nested tools</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Shift + (keyboard shortcut)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Decrease/increase tool size (brush/pencil/clone stamp/etc)</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Make brush harder/softer</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">[ or ]</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Shift ] or Shift [</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Know modifier keys</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">(see page 34 + 35)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Dodge / Burn tool</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>NEVER USE</u> these tools (they are destructive editing, and thus, <u>EVIL</u>)</p>
